

FROM THE ENERGY COMMITTEE

The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) will provide new tax credits and rebates for home energy improvements, electric vehicles, solar, batteries, heat pumps and more. At this time, these rebates are **not** available. USDOE is currently conducting stakeholder outreach, developing program guidance, and hosting listening sessions with key stakeholders. Rules and guidelines are expected to be provided by mid-2023. Then states can submit applications for the funds, explaining how they will determine income eligibility, energy reduction results, train contractors, administer discounts through contractors' invoices, etc. Finally, funds will hopefully be awarded by end of 2023 or early 2024.
